In 2002 she got on the Honour List of IBBY and a special mention on The White Ravens.

And because between kids and dragons no explanations are needed, Roco knows what to do so that Milo can join the great flock of dragons back, which will pass through the sky in three weeks and one day.

Milo, the weak dragon, needs to learn how to fly properly in order to get back together with his flock of dragons. Roco knows that inside the books there are solutions for all the problems.

Diciembre Super Álbum (December Super Album)



In December's Super Album the last issue of the series "The traveller" comes out: a man that goes from town to town behind the trail of an amusement park called "Budapest" and his beloved Natalia. Scriptwriter and cartoonist work hand in hand to give an end to Santiago's story, and they tell us about what happened when the amusement park was set up in the village, and how the neighbours confronted and fought to evacuate it. But they also argue about the evolution of the story, the creative processes and the different forms to reflect it on paper. The two stories we find in this novel belong to

A theatre actor will open the doors of his house and will make the kids discover a new world, inhabited and illuminated by Shakespeare. All of them will be questioned in this theatre of feelings: Justina, so desperate to be loved that she cannot say no. Manuel, who goes through life practicing parkour. Guadalupe, who walks on a red carpet of

In this story, Liliana Bodoc presents us a metaphor in which a child, a pet and a painter take part, and shows how it is possible to solve, with the help of an artifice, the absence or the loss, when love is the mediator.



El espejo africano (The African Mirror)





From there, the mirror becomes the thread of a story that connects different characters, times, and the three continents of Africa, America, and Europe. Bodoc depicts the hard struggle that many men and women faced to win their freedom. It's a story that

began two centuries ago but it has not come to an end yet.

El perro del peregrino (The Pilgrim's Dog)



Elisa. La rosa inesperada (Elisa. The Unexpected Rose)



The search for happiness, the awakening of sexuality, self-knowledge, and the construction of identity in adolescence are some themes in this novel. But one of the main subjects the story features is human trafficking and sexual violence. Linked to this problem is the complicity and indifference of a society marked by class status. It might seem a rather hard and dark subject for a juvenile literature book, but being one of the many problems that affect our real world it's necessary to address it openly.

Bodoc draws a social portrait of a hopeless lower class that can only sink in marginality or just keep on going. Elisa, the young protagonist, advances

without knowing exactly where she is going or what the hell (using the writer's own words) could get in her way. There is magic and mystery, lights and shadows that come together to create a world as disturbing as magical. To write this novel Liliana Bodoc travelled to the towns of San Salvador de Jujuy, Tilcara and Santa Fe. It was the first time she decided to travel and write. It was also the first time she decided to share her writing methodology with her readers.

Ilustrated by: Viviana Garofoli.




The world, the jungle in this case, is different depending on how each person looks at it. There are many ways to define places and Simi Tití wants to experiment how to see them with eyeglasses, despite his mother's prohibition. His mother's voice haunts him each time he is tempted to transgress, but finally he "decides to disobey by order of importance". First, he wears his oldest brother's eyeglasses, then his mother's and finally his grandfather's. To see through someone else's

eyes gives him an idea. And he looks again at the world with different eyes. Gazes, perspectives, renovations and memories are paintbrushes Lilina Bodoc and Viviana Garófoli give us full of poetry, from words to images.



El mapa imposible (The Impossible Map)





Thus, the author succeeds in creating a universe of play that enhances imagination and fantasy.

In Red, the devil finds love in the Roses Market. But winning the beautiful woman selling apples hides an enormous secret. In White, the old Eskimo says: "The bear's moon, the full moon, the wolf's moon and the dead moon; that's how moons succeed one another in the sky". And he begins to tell a story... In Yellow, the emperor Ye-Low sweet naps

become bitter lemon nightmares. Tormented naps where he can't fall asleep even after he scrubs himself with sulphur or refers to the Great Book on home remedies. In Green, two married farmers can't stop arguing. He can only hear his plants growing and she can only listen to misfortune looming in the air. In Black a kind chimney sweep receives the anticipated visit of a young woman who, dressed in mourning, invites him to part before midnight.

His mistress, an eleven year old girl, is having problems he can't decipher. She cries a lot in her room and smells sad. When her parents leave her in charge of the grandparents, he is determined to find out what ails her.

In order to do so he will have to trust a lousy poet of a dog and a stray one, and the enigmatic Berenice, a black cat who keeps too many secrets. In his

adventure, Lilo will also face his worst fear: exposing his chubby body and his short legs to Muriel

His courage comes from the love he feels for his pack of humans: the girl and her grandparents. Nothing makes a dog happier than making his human companions happy.

Thanks to his sense of smell, Lilo not only finds out the source of his mistress' grief. He also reflects on the strange reactions of human beings, their insensitivity towards each other and the ways in which they neglect a world full of prodigies.

down at any moment, but he's determined to put up a fight.

As they can't be seen together in the daytime, much of the book is set at night. The two children are enemies at first, but they come to know and trust each other. This results in interactions that are both moving and hilarious, with the emotional highpoint the scene in which Alaska finally has to choose for herself which of her owners she wants to be with.


Alaska is another brilliantly constructed and subtly composed book by Woltz, full of humour, dynamism and layers. It's about searching for your identity and dealing with emotions like shame and jealousy, which become a real issue at the start of puberty. And about the big and complex world that you have to negotiate as a 13-year-old, particularly at school with all its unwritten rules and codes, which are often so very confusing.

Anna Woltz succeeds in clearly presenting complicated emotions in accessible yet stylistically sophisticated language: 'If there was a sport called epilepsy, there's no way in a million years I'd ever choose to join the club.' *Alaska* is a cinematic adventure that will appeal to many children, partly because of the positive outcome.

Gips (Plaster Cast)



Gips is set in a hospital and takes place during one cold winter day. The 12year-old girl Fitz is furious with her parents for getting divorced. She has decided never to fall in love – but then she meets fifteen-year-old Adam and things just spiral out of control.

Gips is a humorous romantic comedy about stealing plaster, courageous people who need stitches and about deciding what to do: will you stay in the waiting room forever? Or will you just take a chance and fall in love?

The books has won the *Gouden Griffel 2016* and was nominated for the *German Jugendliteraturpreis 2017*.

An unconventional hospital adventure about the fundamental question of whether love should be just for now or forever.

Mijn bijzonder rare week met Tess (My particularly week with Tessa)



A beautifully fresh island adventure about a girl who enlists a boy to help her connect with her father, who doesn't even know she exists.

How is it possible that Anna Woltz has not yet won any major children's book awards? Perhaps it's because she writes small adventures that are deceptively straightforward in their tone. However, the emotional depth that award committees are usually looking for is most definitely present in her work.

What makes Woltz such a good children's writer is that she understands that children want first and foremost to read an exciting adventure story, but at the same time her characters – and her readors – also learn a great deal about themselves and about life.

During the May holiday on the Dutch island of Texel, ten-year-old Samuel meets eleven-year-old Tess, a boisterous and rather bossy islander. He quickly becomes involved in a bizarre plan that Tess has concocted so that she can get to know her father, who has no idea that she exists. Tess has found his name in one of her mum's old scrapbooks, tracked him down on the internet and invited him to stay for free in their holiday home – without telling him that she's his daughter and most definitely without letting her mum in on the plan. She intends to test him for a week to see if she really wants to have him as a dad, but of course all kinds of things go wrong.

Woltz delights her readers with such beautiful insights, skilfully weaving together all of the threads of the plot to craft a very moving conclusion.
